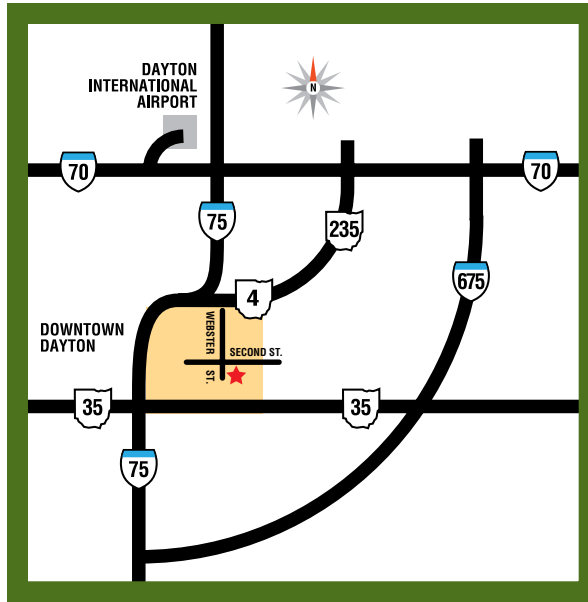


Volunteer Opportunities

This open-air market housed in a renovated railroad freight house offers a variety of local growers, producers, artisans and prepared food vendors. The Market is unlike any other MetroParks facility, but because of its unique aspects, it is able to contribute to the mission of Five Rivers MetroParks. The Market provides convenient access to local foods and organic products, reducing the need for pollution from transportation, contributing to environmental protection. It also connects local growers with buyers and offers programming that promotes sustainability. Even its renovated structure adds to its ecological appeal by making new use of an existing structure and adding to the overall vibrancy of downtown Dayton.

The Market is open year round. Stop by often and check out everything fresh, unique and local!

Things to Do

VENDORS - More than forty vendors sell their locally produced wares at the Market. Purchase items for gifts or sundries, such as homemade soaps and lotions, jewelry, handmade clothing, bird feeders, potted plants, scented candles, or environmentally friendly products for the home. You'll also find everything you need to prepare delicious and healthy meals right at your fingertips - from dry goods to soup mixes to fresh produce to meats, cheeses and breads, stock your pantry with local bounty. Prepared food vendors also are on hand to satisfy and craving. Sink your teeth into something sweet or savory. Choose from items such as crepes, Thai dishes, vegan, sandwiches, Mediterranean fare, cabbage rolls, Latin American favorites and so much more!
