



# SHUMARD OAK

Quercus shumardii (KWURK-us SHOO-murd-ee-eye)

### **ABOUT:**

This large shade tree grows in bottomlands and lowlands, including sites along streams and lakes, valleys, floodplains and at the edge of swamps. It's the host plant for several butterflies. Woodpeckers, blue jays, small mammals, wild turkeys, white-tailed deer and black bears eat its acorns.

# **LEAF**



6-8 inches long; shiny, dark green in summer and brownish-red in late fall

### **SEED**



3/4 to 1.25-inch acorns; bowl-shaped, scaly

# **BARK**



Dark, deep furrows; light gray to white scaly ridge tops
