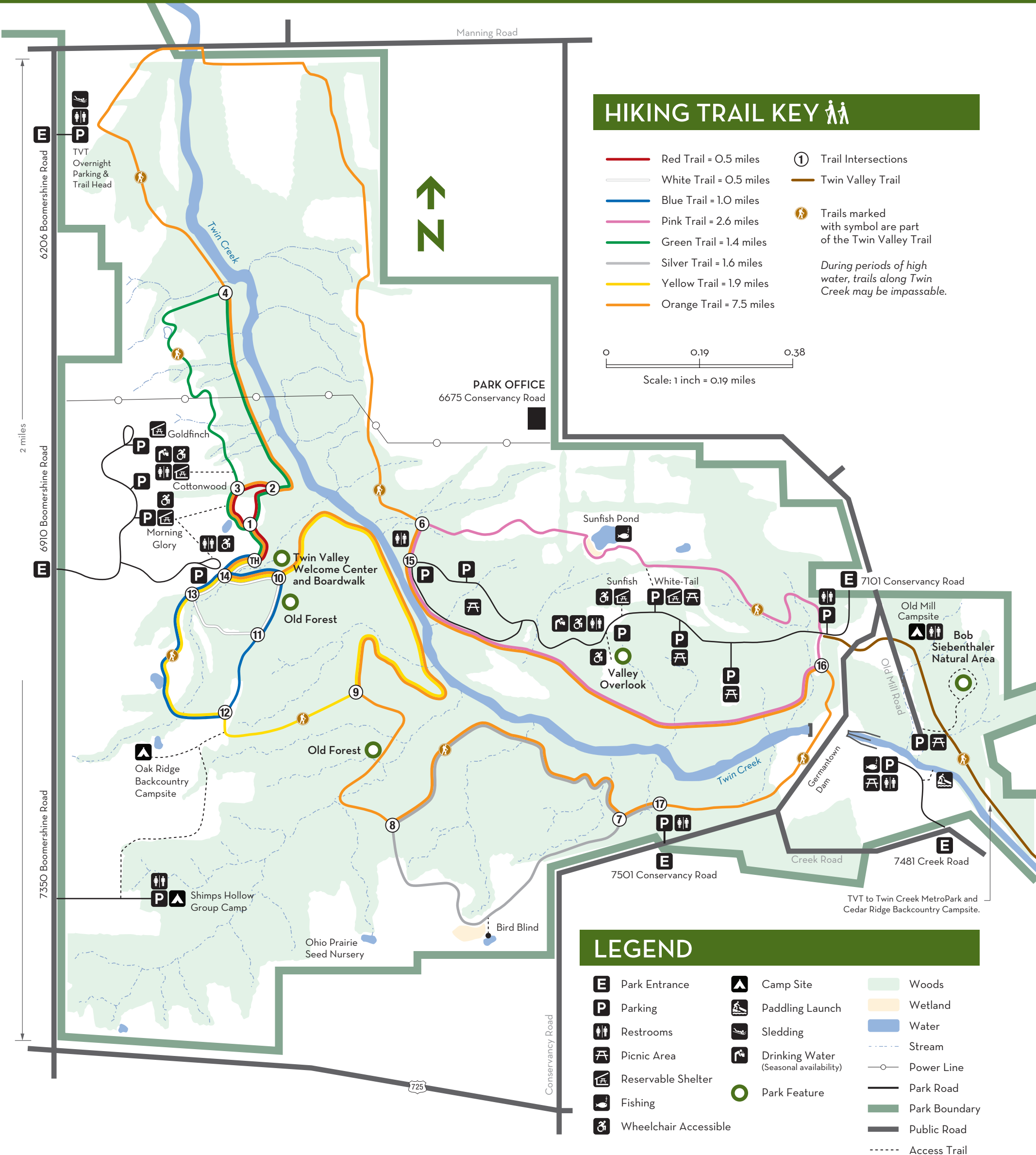


GERMANTOWN METROPARK • PARK MAP



HIKING TRAIL KEY

- Red Trail = 0.5 miles
 - White Trail = 0.5 miles
 - Blue Trail = 1.0 miles
 - Pink Trail = 2.6 miles
 - Green Trail = 1.4 miles

 - Yellow Trail = 1.9 miles
 - Orange Trail = 7.5 miles

PARK FEATURES

BOB SIEBENTHALER NATURAL AREA
This beautiful woodland offers a rich display of spring wildflowers and scenic hiking year-round. The area honors the many contributions former MetroParks Commissioner Bob Siebenthaler made to land stewardship and conservation in the Miami Valley.

OLD FOREST
One of the most exciting features of this park is the mature and old-growth woodland preserved here. It is the largest tract of old woods in Montgomery County. This magnificent forested area is filled with large, old trees hinting at what Ohio's forests were like before European settlement. Due to its size, it provides crucial habitat for species not found in other areas. A variety of small orchids have been found, and wildflowers carpet the Old Forest in the spring. Wild turkeys have also been spotted. Breeding bird surveys indicate brown creepers and summer tanagers nest here, both rare occurrences for Montgomery County.

VALLEY OVERLOOK
For a spectacular view, especially during the peak of fall color, stop at the Valley Overlook. Year-round, this site provides a scenic view into and across Twin Creek Valley. Park at the restroom parking lot and follow the path to the wooden overlook platform.

TWIN VALLEY WELCOME CENTER
This welcome center provides a gateway to the Twin Valley, an area of rich natural habitats comprising Twin Creek and Germantown MetroParks, as well as the Upper Twin Conservation Area. Guests will find restrooms, bird viewing and a hiking center for hikers to meet up, get water, use facilities. Visit metroparks.org/tvwelcomecenter for more info.
