- 78 miles of hiking trails and a 29-mile backpacking trail



COVER STORY

These are just four of the stories about people who took back their health using nature as their top tool.

Since the onset of the pandemic, park attendance figures show more people have been spending time outdoors, discovering the healing effects of nature. Those effects are backed up by an ever-growing body of scientific research, said Scott Hall, University of Dayton professor and clinical mental health counseling program coordinator.

Here are a handful of the ways nature makes humans healthier: Time outdoors lowers blood pressure and stress hormones, reduces muscle tension, and boosts your immune system. It increases energy levels and improves sleep. Nature has additional benefits for kids, improving everything from problem solving to coordination.

Don't just take it from us: Your Five Rivers MetroParks is full of places and ways to enjoy the outdoors for every age, ability and interest — whether you prefer to sit on a park bench and listen to birds or take an overnight backpacking adventure. Indeed, nature is accessible to every person and every family in our community.

"Research really highlights the fact that nature, just by its design, promotes wellbeing in physical, mental, emotional and social health. You can experience



a curative effect by just 20 minutes in nature," Hall said, adding that filling your life with more nature can be as simple as getting a houseplant — or just stepping outside to breathe fresh air. "You don't have to go to these far ends of the world to connect with nature."

Your Five Rivers MetroParks protects more than 16,500 acres of land in the Montgomery County region. That's more acres than comprise the cities of Kettering, approximately 10,500 acres, and Huber Heights, approximately 14,200 acres.

MetroParks maintains 90% of those 16,500 acres in their natural state, managed so habitats for plants and wildlife are a priority. Doing so preserves clean water and air, and it supports biodiversity.

Indeed, Five Rivers MetroParks is a conservation agency, and protecting the region's natural heritage is at the heart of everything it does — from making the Wagner Subaru Outdoor Experience a waste-free event to conducting controlled burns to support native prairie and edge/thicket habitat.

Conservation efforts focus on river corridors and land adjacent to existing MetroParks to preserve habitat on the largest scale possible, connect existing open space and protect distinct natural

features. Doing so provides wildlife, flora and fauna better places to live and thrive — and gives people access to beautiful, pristine places where they can connect with nature and improve their physical and mental health.

You'll find these special outdoor places at all 18 of your MetroParks. In addition to its parks, Five Rivers MetroParks protects conservation areas, which are significant tracts of land primarily in a natural state with minimal infrastructure.

Most conservation areas currently have very limited access due to lack of trails and parking, although three have enhanced public access for visitors:

- Dull Woods, 8199 Cole St. in Brookville: Accessible from the Wolf Creek paved trail, approximately 1 mile from the parking lot, a boardwalk winds through a swamp forest remnant.
- Medlar, 4558 Medlar Rd. in Miamisburg: Explore diverse habitats, including a mature woods and wetlands, along the paved 2.25mile Great-Little paved trail.

Spring Run Conservation Area in Trotwood is slowly being transformed into a new MetroPark. Staff and volunteers have been converting this land, once farmland and a golf course, to native grassland, forest and wetlands for nearly a decade. In August 2022, additional wetland restoration work began with an H2Ohio grant from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. Spring Run's 540 acres are adjacent to Sycamore State Park — providing a large area for wildlife habitat and open space protection in western Montgomery County.







Tropical waters once covered present-day Ohio, and Montgomery County is a prime location for discovering fossils of creatures that lived around 450 million years ago. Swamp milkweed, native to southwestern Ohio, is the only plant that feeds monarch caterpillars and butterflies. Crepuscular animals are active during dawn and dusk. In 1830, you could buy 158 acres of farmland for \$2,000. Lasagna gardening means layering compost with other natural materials to create super-healthy soil — not growing tomatoes, basil and other veggies to put in lasagna.

These are just a handful of the factoids children and adults who attend a Five

Rivers MetroParks educational program might learn. MetroParks naturalists and other expert staff and volunteers offer programs year-round covering a wide range of topics, including gardening, animal tracking and tree identification, composting at home, nature photography, heritage and history, sustainable living, and much more. Some programs are specific to adults, while others are for children and teens, such as Tike Hikes, Conservation Kids and Conservation Leaders. (See pages 20-25.)

Yet programs are only one way to learn about nature: Facilities, interpretive signage, events and more throughout

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EDUCATION

MetroParks provide a dose of education with your outdoor adventure. MetroParks also offers community resources for classroom teachers and other groups. For example:

- Experience life in the 1880s at the Historical Farm and Visitor Center at Carriage Hill MetroPark.
- Stroll through the Inventors Walk at RiverScape MetroPark to discover the many, and sometimes lifestylechanging, things created in Dayton.
- Hike the purple trail at Possum Creek MetroPark and stop along the way to learn about (and see remnants of) the 1930s Argonne Forest amusement park.
- Attend the Small Farm and Food Fest on Aug. 5 to learn about sustainable living, as well as growing, raising, preparing and sourcing local food.
- Spend the weekend of Oct. 7-8 at the Wagner Subaru Outdoor Experience to learn about recreational opportunities in our region and to try fly fishing, cycling, paddling and more.
- Work with MetroParks staff to create a Green Schoolyard, vegetable and habitat gardens that serve as ecological teaching tools and provide a place where children can connect with nature.
- Visit the 2nd Street Market to learn about the importance of local food.

Another option: Go outside or visit one of your MetroParks and observe the natural world around you. Snap a quick photo or keep a nature journal so you can learn more later about what you saw.

Indeed, regardless of where the classroom is located, what you learn at MetroParks will help you connect with nature, live more sustainably, protect our natural heritage and enjoy a healthy, active lifestyle.

Dayton is increasingly becoming known as a great place to surf and whitewater paddle.

Also growing: Its reputation as the Outdoor Adventure Capital of the Midwest, as well as awareness that the region is home to the nation's largest paved trail network, with more than 350 miles to explore.

Five Rivers MetroParks manages 165 miles of trails for hiking, cycling, horseback riding and more, as well as 42 miles of the region's 270 miles of river corridor. MetroParks is home to outdoor recreation facilities and amenities for almost any interest, whether you enjoy more passive activities, such as fishing and nature photography, or more intense ones, such as mountain biking, backpacking and, yes, paddling. Examples include:

- Blue Heron Disc Golf Course at Englewood MetroPark
- Boating, both motorized at Eastwood MetroPark and nonmotorized at numerous parks
- Camping at frontcountry, backcountry and trailside sites
- · Carriage Hill MetroPark Riding Center
- Cycling, walking, rollerblading and more on paved trails

- Fishing options, including stocked ponds and areas where you can fish without a license
- Geocaching at numerous MetroParks
- Heart Healthy Trails at eight locations
- Hiking on more than 75 miles of natural surface trails
- Horseback riding on more than 30 miles of equestrian trails
- MetroParks Mountain Biking Area (MoMBA) at Huffman MetroPark
- MetroParks Ice Rink at RiverScape MetroPark
- · Mindfulness Walks at four locations
- Nature Play Areas at numerous MetroParks
- · RiverScape River Run whitewater features
- · Sledding hills at three parks
- Twin Valley Backpacking Trail in Germantown and Twin Creek MetroParks
- · Wildlife viewing and bird blinds

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

they give. With degrees in horticulture and natural resources, plus years of experience as a landscape designer and arborist, Bush is always educating volunteers.

Lessons such as these are just one reason people volunteer with MetroParks. Yet whatever their role, assistance from MetroParks volunteers is so important and valued. Volunteers provide an important community service, working side-by-side with staff. Five Rivers MetroParks volunteers extend the agency's resources and help MetroParks accomplish its mission. In 2022, approximately 1,410 volunteers served 18,038 hours in MetroParks at programs and special events — for a value to the agency of more than \$488,000.

opportunities so everyone can find something that meets their passion – and schedule. People of all ages and abilities are MetroParks volunteers.


- Fun and rewarding: Volunteers share their interests with people of all ages and improve our region's quality of life.





Providing access to nature and outdoor experiences is critical to MetroParks' mission — and to people's health and wellbeing. To support this, the Five Rivers MetroParks Foundation offers an Access to Nature financial assistance program to reduce financial barriers for people to take MetroParks programs, rent shelters and more.

As of December 2022, the foundation had provided funding for nearly 850 financial assistance awards. Aryel Newman and her mother, Tracy Lawlah, used the assistance to fish, paddle and camp. For example, Lawlah took MetroParks' paddling safety program, followed by a program in which she and Aryel paddled for the first time in moving water.

"We had been wanting to paddle the river for some time, but were worried about what could happen," said Newman, noting the idea of attending a program

eased those worries since an instructor and other attendees would be present. "It was very informative – we learned how to maneuver in whitewater."

Access to Nature is just one of the many items the Five Rivers MetroParks Foundation supports. In 2022, for example, it funded park benches and swings, the award-winning Growing for Good program that helps residents living in food deserts start successful gardens, Kids in Parks trails, support for park and conservation maintenance, and much more. The James M. Cox, Jr. Arboretum Foundation and Wegerzyn Gardens Foundation also provide philanthropic support at those MetroParks.

You can help the Five Rivers MetroParks Foundation secure funding for special projects and programming, as well as an endowment. Charitable contributions can support all MetroParks or one specific park, educational and recreation services, conservation initiatives, and more. In 2023, MetroParks' philanthropy team is creating even more ways to give, adding to the many options already available.






PARK SYSTEM MAP
