Five Rivers MetroParks is the region's conservation leader by protecting, preserving and maintaining local green space and waterways. Conservation efforts focus on river corridors, areas surrounding parks, and connecting significant tracts of land to preserve habitat on the largest scale possible for plants and wildlife.






RIVERSCAPE METROPARK

Located along the scenic Great Miami River, this MetroPark is a community gathering place that is active year-round and is the hub of the region's more than 350 miles of paved trails. Grab ice cream and experience the Five Rivers Fountain of Lights, one of the world's largest fountains. In winter, RiverScape MetroPark is home to a covered outdoor ice skating rink.







TRAILS FOR A VARIETY OF USERS


- 25 miles of equestrian trails
- 9-plus miles of mountain biking trails
- Trails accessible to those who use mobility devices
- 78 miles of hiking trails and a 29-mile backpacking trail
- 270 miles of water trails
- The nation's largest paved trail network with more than 350 miles to explore

All MetroParks trails are loops marked by colors. You'll find maps showing your current location at parking lots, trailheads and many trail intersections. MetroParks does not have any mixed-use trails. Always stay on marked trails.

RESERVATIONS AND PERMITS

SHELTERS: MetroParks has 44 reservable shelters; fees vary. Shelters without a reservation are available at no charge; first-come, first-served.

CAMPING: MetroParks has 23 tent campsites and three trailside campsites. Permits are required; fees vary; reserve in advance.

PERMITS: For activities such as taking commercial photography, holding a wedding or special event, or conducting research you must first apply for a permit.

PARKS & CONSERVATION AREAS



2ND STREET MARKET

Shop dozens of local small businesses in a quaint environment.



CARRIAGE HILL METROPARK

Experience life in the 1880s at the farm and Visitor Center. Explore on horseback at the Riding Center.



DEEDS POINT METROPARK

Enjoy a picturesque view of the downtown skyline and learn about the city's aviation heritage.



ENGLEWOOD METROPARK

Located along the Scenic Stillwater River, this park is a popular destination to spot wildlife.



HILLS & DALES METROPARK

This urban forest has been a refuge for Daytonians since 1907.



AULLWOOD GARDEN METROPARK

Year-round, view beautiful plants on display in this tranquil area.



COX ARBORETUM METROPARK

Stroll landscaped gardens; hike woodlands and meadows.



EASTWOOD METROPARK

Recreate on Eastwood Lake and in the Mad River at this hub of water-based activities.



GERMANTOWN METROPARK

Explore some of the region's most beautiful, remote landscapes.



HUFFMAN METROPARK

Named after the founders of the Huffy Bike Corporation and home to MoMBA.



ISLAND METROPARK

Enjoy this long-time urban oasis just north of downtown.



RIVERSCAPE METROPARK

This park on the banks of the Great Miami River is lively year-round.



SUNRISE METROPARK

Enjoy downtown skyline views along the Great Miami River.



TWIN CREEK METROPARK

Experience the wilderness in this remote park.



WESLEYAN METROPARK

Relax at this neighborhood park situated along Wolf Creek.



MEDLAR CONSERVATION AREA

The Great-Little paved trail runs through this restored natural area.



POSSUM CREEK METROPARK

Get active outdoors while exploring farming and diverse habitats at this hidden gem.



SUGARCREEK METROPARK

Popular for trail running with views of the scenic creek.



TAYLORSVILLE METROPARK

Located where the crossroads of America once stood



WEGERZYN GARDENS METROPARK

Explore gardens and a rare remnant of a swamp forest.



DULL WOODS CONSERVATION AREA

This 8-acre woodlot features an unusual remnant of a swamp forest.



WOODMAN FEN CONSERVATION AREA

Hike around Dayton's only fen, a rare groundwater-fed wetland.
